



Work is going well – cement poured and drying nicely; framing should start this week, and Bethlehem moved into place. Thank you for your patience as we get through this "messiest" stage of the project!



We have been given the cost for the project by Bakker Design and Build. Costs have gone up since our last congregational meeting, largely due to a steep increase in building supplies, due to heavy demand in the southern USA as a result of hurricane and flood damage. Our plans also now give us a better, safer building. The basic breakdown is as follows:

Grand Estimated total = \$517,500.00 HST= 67,589.00 (most HST will be refunded; \$21,000.00 not refunded).

In 1887, after much discussion and a close vote, a chapel organ was purchased for the church. Mr. Grattis was the first choir intrsuctor, and may have been the first organist. In

1892, Miss M. Traver was hired as organist, at a stipend of \$6.25 cents every three months. Miss Munns became organist in 1893, as Miss M. Traver became Mrs. William Tudor. After a brief time adjusting to married life, Mrs. Tudor again sat on the bench at church organist. On February 27, 1907, the organist's stipend was raised to \$50 per year.

Session has agreed to have KPC become a monthly partner with INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE MISSION. We will be giving \$50 per month to the very worthy ministry.

We will watch a short video this morning describing the work of IJM. IJM works all over the world to help free people from slavery, particularly women and children, and young children who are victims of sex trafficking and exploitation.

IJM's Canadian office is in London, ON. If anyone is interested (especially if you did not do a shoebox this year) we can help with defending widows and orphans who often lose everything to debt, through property grabbing and the greed of others who prey on the vulnerable. \$60 can help one such family be rescued from violence, win back what was stolen, and make sure they are safe enough to thrive again. IJM will help each widow get back on her feet to provide for her family and make sure orphans are cared for and that their rights are protected as they grow up. Your gift will be designated to IJM Canada's Property Grabbing Projects. Perhaps as a congregation we could donate towards helping 3 widows and their children, with gifts to total \$180.00. We do not want to put undue pressure on our congregation at a time when people are being incredibly generous, but also feel very keenly the immense needs of others in danger who are so vulnerable.
