THE STORY: Chapter 25 in THE STORY Bible THANKSGIVING!

The tuning fork was the first musical instrument used in the church. A precentor would tap the tuning fork, establish a note, and lead the congregation in singing,

primarily Psalms from the Scottish Psalter. The first precentor was Mr. James Gordon. On January 26, 1874, Mr. Robert Rae moved, seconded by Mr. Dallas that "the sum of \$25 be given to Mr. Gordon for serving as precentor in the past." As next week is Thanksgiving, we want to decorate the sanctuary to offer an expression of thanks to our Lord! It would be very helpful if people shared the task – could you bring in a pumpkin? squash? apples? potatoes? some fall mums? onions? carrots? gourds? unhusked corn? garden flowers? canning and preserves from your kitchen? rustic items like baskets, old tools? You can bring those items to the church during the week, anytime the church is open – please bring them to the sanctuary near the platform. We will do the actual decorating next Sunday morning at 8.30 a.m. Coffee and muffins supplied! Let us "give thanks to the Lord our God" as we decorate the Lord's house! Thank you so much!
